The group also discussed continuing to support and enhance our monitoring and compliance by looking at our code enforcement framework and decision making process when issues arise. We will also review the management of contracts and co-branding opportunities that the University engages in. Members of the committee expressed an interest to hear directly from the President or the President's staff regarding the direction on these issues.

Kyle Muncy updated the group on the latest status involving VF Corporation and JanSport. Neither licensee is currently sourcing in Bangladesh. The Collegiate Licensing Company reports that all UConn licensees that currently source in Bangladesh have signed onto the Bangladesh Safety Accord. Kyle will continue communications with all licensees regarding factory safety, monitor all ongoing issues and report back to the committee with any developments that warrant further discussion.
