Given its position as a market leader, Nike's decisions influence the decisions of other companies in the sector. The group discussed next steps for ensuring continued discussion on this issue, both within the PCCSR and with licensees. Shareen and Kyle will continue to monitor the situation and provide information as it becomes available. Shareen and Kyle will meet in the coming months with Liz Kennedy from CLC to discuss next potential steps.

Rich Miller, joined by UConn student Anna Middendorf (a junior Political Science & Human Rights major) discussed the recent trip to the UN Climate Change Conference at Paris held in December 2015. The Office of Environmental Policy also co-sponsored a Higher Education event at the summit. Students attended many of the workshops throughout each day. OEP aims to formalize this experience so that future student groups to have the same opportunities and anticipates continuing support from a wide variety of sponsors across campus.
